The Governor of Punjab is pleased to appoint the Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar (herein after referred as the university) as the authority competent to conduct the centralized counseling for B.Ed. course for the Session 2016-17 in all the Colleges of Education (Govt. Govt. Aided, Private Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated to (1) Panjab University, Chandigarh (2) Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar, (3) Punjabi University Patiala based on Common Entrance Test (CET) to be conducted in accordance with the judgment of Hon'ble High Court in LPA No. 1267 of 2010 State of Punjab versus self financed B.Ed. Colleges Association, Punjab (Regd.) and others. Relevant part of judgment is reproduced as under:-

34. Accordingly, in our opinion, a direction is liable to be issued to the State of Punjab that the State should hold a Common Entrance Test as per its policy for the B.Ed. Course before the start of every academic year for admission to the College of Educations situated in the State which are recognized and affiliated. The admission shall be made upon the merit obtained in the test conducted in accordance with the laid down norms and to the extent of the intake capacity prescribed by the Council. The said exercise should be carried out two months in advance before the start of the academic session so that the students are not left in suspense and can apply for admission on the basis of the result so declared.
35. Consequently, the issues arising in these appeals are answered against the association and it is held that they do not have any absolute right to remain out of the CET to be conducted by the State even though they are unaided and recognized institutes, in the absence of any challenge to the regulations issued under NCTE Act.
36. It is also held that by holding CET, Article 19(1) (g) of the Constitution of India is not violated as the paramount consideration being merit and the State having the authority under the Statute can hold the test and it only

amounts to a regulatory measure on the admission process and does not impinge on the autonomy of the unaided institutes to run and administer the same.

37. As an upshot of the above discussion, the present appeals are allowed. The judgment of the Learned Single Judge dated 01.07.2010 passed in CWP No. 10091 of 2009 is set aside and the writ petitions are dismissed. However, the State shall remain bound by directions hereinbefore made and shall comply with the same for the next academic session, i.e., 2016 onwards as the admission for the year 2015-16 is under process. It is further clarified that any admissions, made in pursuance of the judgment of the Learned Single Judge and in view of the examinations conducted by the Association, will not stand affected by the present judgment, directions of which are to operate from the academic session 2016-17.

(3) **ELIGIBILITY:-**

- a) i) ****Candidates with at least 50 % marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/ Humanities , Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification declared equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.**
- ii) ****The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favour of the reserved categories shall be as per rules of the concerned Govt. of Punjab.**

****The above norms are as per Para 3(2) of Appendix IV of N.C.T.E. Notification 2014.**

Note-i):- Any candidate with less than 50% or less marks would not be eligible.

Note-ii):- There shall be a relaxation of 5 % marks in favor of SC/BC candidates. Candidate with less than 45% marks belonging to these categories shall not be eligible.

Provided that such minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a candidate to get admission in an institution but only entitle the candidate concerned to fulfill other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the Government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

- b) Candidate must have studied the major subject of the subject combination for at least two years at Bachelor's level/Master's level. Honors students shall opt for major subject in which they have obtained Honors, the minor subject should have been studied at least for one year.

candidates would be allotted minor subject by the college on the basis of other subject option/s permissible to the candidate by the respective University and the availability of the same in the respective college.

PLACEMENT OF CANDIDATES :-

- a) The admission to all Education Colleges (Govt., Aided and Self-Financed Colleges) of these Universities & situated in state of Punjab will be done strictly as per norms laid down by N.C.T.E and by the Admission Committee to be constituted by the Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar. The mode of admission through Common Entrance Test and counseling shall be determined and notified separately by the Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar.

However, admission to the seats under 15% (All India) quota will be done as per Reservation Policy of the Central Govt.

- b) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria in order of preference:-
- (i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
 - (ii) Candidate older in age.

6) **DIVISION OF SEATS :-**

- a) In Punjab, 85% seats will be reserved for the Candidates from within the State and 15% will be open to candidates of other States/U.Ts on All India basis. The eligibility criteria for 85% seats will be that the candidate must be a resident of Punjab State in terms of Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-11 Br.) Letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/96 19, dated the 6th June, 1996 and letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/80, dated 1st January, 1999 or have passed 10+1 and 10+2 examination as a regular candidate from a recognized institute situated in Punjab. However, wards of Defence Personnel posted in Punjab are exempted from this condition to the extent that they should have passed qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 from a recognized institution situated in Punjab. Each candidate would be required to submit a certificate to this effect on the prescribed proforma from the Principal/ Head of Institute from where this examination has been passed.
- (b) If sufficient number of candidates belonging to reserved category (ies) is not available, the vacant seats will be offered to candidates in the open category. Likewise, if seats under 85% state category remain vacant, these would be transferred to 15% all India category and vice-versa.

(C) The above Clause No.6(a) regarding resident of Punjab State shall not be applicable to the following categories of candidates :-

- (i) Children, wards and dependents of Punjab Government employees and employees of Boards/ Corporations/Statutory Bodies/Companies/ Co-operative Society set up or owned or controlled by the Punjab Government including those established by or under an Act of the State of Punjab or a Central Act, by the Punjab government, posted within or outside the State of Punjab
- (ii) Children, wards and dependents of members of All India Services born on Punjab Cadre, irrespective of where the officer is posted, This shall also include children, wards and dependents of members of All India Services born on cadres other than that of Punjab provided the said officer is on deputation with Punjab Government or any of its Boards, Corporations, Statutory Bodes, Companies, Co-operative Societies irrespective of his place of posting.
- (iii) Children, wards and dependents of Central Government employees who have served for at least two years in connection with the affairs of the Punjab Government or any of its Boards, Corporations, Statutory Bodies, Companies, Co-operative Societies out of 5 years preceding the year of Common Entrance Test and counseling.
- (iv) Children, wards and dependents of the Punjab Government pensioners settled outside Punjab.
- (v) Children, wards and dependents of military/para military forces personnel belonging to the State of Punjab as per record at the time of their entry in service (A certificate on prescribed Proforma by the Commanding Officers of the Unit to be furnished) and
- (vi) Children, wards and dependents of the ex-employees of military & para military forces personnel belonging to the State of Punjab as per record at the time of their entry into service.
- (d) The guidelines issued for the grant of residence certificate/bonafide resident of Punjab by the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-2 Branch) vide No. 1/3/95-3PP-2/9619, dated the 6th June, 1996 and No. 1/3/95-3PP-2/80 dated the 1st January, 1999 and further instructions, issued by the Department, if any, will be adhered to in letter and spirit while making admission.

(8) GENERAL CONDITIONS:-

1. The merit of each candidate shall be determined on the basis of marks secured by him or her in the Common Entrance Test (CET).
2. The minimum qualifying marks in CET will be 20% for General ⁵⁰ students and 15% for SC/ST candidates. 37.5
3. The combined merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks secured by the candidates in the Common Entrance Test.
4. As 5 % marks (of those obtained in the CET by the candidate) will be given to candidates seeking admissions under 85% quota, which have passed their 8th and 10th classes examination from school situated in rural areas of Punjab. For this, they will have to submit a certificate of that school falling in rural area at the time of passing 8th as well as 10th class issued by the Head of the school, duly counter signed by the concerned D.E.O (by the concerned Sarpanch in case of school affiliated to C.B.S.E/ I.C.S.E)
5. The University will notify the last date for submission of application forms for CET and counseling.
6. The reservation of seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. However, in case seats in a reserved category remain vacant, on account of non-availability of qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up from the general category candidates.
7. The admission of total number of seats in the colleges of education for candidates belonging to different subjects will be done as per the norms laid down by the N.C.T.E as per clause 3.1 of the appendix no. i.e. 1-25 students per teacher for a school subject.
8. Candidates applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form to be submitted to the University in the first instance before the CET. No change of category will be entertained /permitted at a later stage in the application form.
9. The allocation of college will be made through online/offline counseling by the authorized university.
10. There will be only one counseling (As per Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's CWP No. 276 of 2012) for admission to B.Ed. seats and the total process of counseling will be completed in 25 days by the university.
11. The subject combination will be decided by the admission committee constituted by Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar.
12. The counseling schedule will be prepared by the Admission Committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor.

13. ✓ All seats in the B.Ed. colleges of Punjab will be filled through centralized Common Entrance Test followed by counseling by Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar.
14. After completion of counseling the admission committee will take decision about filling of unfilled seats. The method proposed would be in light of the decisions taken by the Punjab and Haryana High Court regarding C.W.P. No. 19518 dated 14.12.2009. The admission committee would fill all the seats subject to the availability of eligible candidates.
15. In counseling only the major subject would be allotted by the university. The minor subject would be allotted by the college. Allocation of seat does not mean confirmation of admission. The admission will be confirmed by the college concerned after checking and verification of documents.
16. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that correct information is provided when the on-line form is filled.
17. Any incorrect information will lead to disqualification.
18. Checking final certificates of the students allocated to the college would be the responsibility of the college.
19. In the first instance, counseling of All India seats will be held. The seats falling vacant in the All India quota will be converted into **85% state Quota Science and Arts seats.** Then counseling for Science seats will be held. The seats falling vacant in the Science quota will be converted into Arts seats. After that, the counseling will start for the Arts seats.
20. Whatsoever information the college wants to give to the candidate should be made available on the college website. A separate printed prospectus is not required. There should be a help desk in each college to guide the students about the subject combinations and filling up of admission forms.
21. The candidates shall deposit half of the Semester fee at the time of admission with the college in which they are admitted and remaining fee of the semester in the month of Sept/Oct, as decided by the concerned college and advertised in the prospectus of the college. The 2nd fee will be collected at the start of the 2nd Semester.
22. The candidates who are admitted in the Government College of Education and the Regional Centre, Bathinda of Punjabi University, Patiala shall deposit their fee directly in their respective colleges / regional centre.
23. ✓ The university shall submit the complete list of admitted candidates to the undersigned with a copy to the Director of Public Instructions (Colleges) Punjab within one month of the completion of admission process.

(9) **MANAGEMENT QUOTA SEATS:-**

- (1) In pursuance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's Judgment in T.M.A Pai Foundation and others versus State of Karnataka and others and in view of the interim Policy Regulations Notification, dated 10th June 2003 issued by the University Grants Commission 15% of the seats out of 85% state quota seats in un-aided private self-financing institutions shall be treated as

management quota seats and shall be brought out of the purview of centralized counseling to be conducted by the University.

- (2) The University shall exclude the management quota seats (showing the subject combination) from the centralized counseling and accordingly publish the details of these seats (institute-wise) provided by the respective institutes.
- (3) The seats under the management quota shall be filled up by the concerned institute in the following manner:-
 - (a) The management quota seats will be filled up after counseling only.
 - (b) Each institute duly authorized by the University conducting the counseling shall publish an advertisement, mentioning the name of the institute and seats against subject-wise combinations offered, in two leading newspapers (i.e. one in English and one in Punjabi Language) on the last day of counseling and may repeat this advertisement subsequently.
 - (c) The Management of the Institute shall fill up management quota seats on the basis of combined merit list through its own counseling in a transparent manner.
 - (d) There shall be no reservation, whatsoever, in respect of the prescribed management quota seats.
 - (e) The concerned college shall have to inform in advance whether stay in hostel is compulsory or not and if yes what are the hostel charges inclusive of rent, mess charges etc.
 - (f) The basic eligibility criteria regarding educational qualification etc. shall remain the same as printed in the Brochure/Prospectus and as prescribed by the respective university.

10. The Schedule for B.Ed. Admissions will be notified / published by Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar.

✓ 11. Fees & Funds:

- i) For admission to private self financed B. Ed. colleges the fee and funds structure will be according to the instruction issued by the Government of Punjab.
12. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar shall be final.

ELIGIBILITY:-

a) i) **Candidates with at least 50 % marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/ Humanities , Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification declared equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.

ii) **The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favour of the reserved categories shall be as per rules of the concerned Govt. of Punjab.

**The above norms are as per Para 3(2) of Appendix IV of N.C.T.E. Notification 2014.

Note-i):- Any candidate with less than 50% or less marks would not be eligible.

Note-ii):- There shall be a relaxation of 5 % marks in favour of SC/BC candidates.

Candidate with less than 45% marks belonging to these categories shall not be eligible.

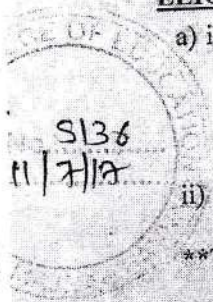

5) **PLACEMENT OF CANDIDATES :-**

- a) The admission to all Education Colleges (Govt., Govt. Aided and Self-Financed Colleges) of these Universities & situated in state of Punjab will be done strictly as per norms laid down by N.C.T.E and by the Admission Committee to be constituted by the Panjab University, Chandigarh. The mode of admission through Common Entrance Test and counseling shall be determined and notified separately by the Panjab University, Chandigarh. However, admission to the seats under 15% (All India) quota will be done as per Reservation Policy of the Central Govt.
- b) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test, their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria in order of preference:-
- (i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
 - (ii) Candidate older in age.

6) **DIVISION OF SEATS :-**

- a) In Punjab, 85% seats will be reserved for the Candidates from within the State and 15% will be open to candidates of other States/U.Ts on All India basis. The eligibility criteria for 85% seats will be that the candidate must be a resident of Punjab State in terms of Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-11 Br.) Letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/96 19, dated the 6th June, 1996 and letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/80, dated 1st January, 1999 or have passed 10+1 and 10+2 examination as a regular candidate from a recognized institute situated in Punjab. However, wards of Defence Personnel posted in Punjab are exempted from this condition to the extent that they should have passed qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 from a recognized institution situated in Punjab. Each candidate would be required to submit a certificate to this effect on the prescribed proforma from the Principal/ Head of Institute from where this examination has been passed.
- (b) If sufficient number of candidates belonging to reserved category (ies) is not available, the vacant seats will be offered to candidates in the open category. Likewise, if seats under 85% state category remain vacant, these would be transferred to 15% all India category and vice-versa.
- (c) The above Clause No.6(a) regarding resident of Punjab State shall not be applicable to the following categories of candidates :-
- (i) Children, wards and dependents of Punjab Government employees and employees of Boards/ Corporations/Statutory Bodies/Companies/ Co-operative Societies set up or owned or controlled by the Punjab Government including those established by or under an Act of the State of Punjab or a Central Act, by the Punjab government, posted within or outside the State of Punjab
 - (ii) Children, wards and dependents of members of All India Services born on Punjab Cadre, irrespective of where the officer is posted, This shall also include children, wards and dependents of members of All India Services born on cadres other than that of Punjab provided the said officer is on deputation with Punjab Government or any of its Boards, Corporations, Statutory Bodies, Companies, Co-operative Societies irrespective of his place of posting.
 - (iii) Children, wards and dependents of Central Government employees who have served for at least two years in connection with the affairs of the Punjab Government or any of its Boards, Corporations, Statutory Bodies,

Companies, Co-operative Societies out of 5 years preceding the year of Common Entrance Test and counseling.

- (iv) Children, wards and dependents of the Punjab Government pensioners settled outside Punjab.
- (v) Children, wards and dependents of military/para military forces personnel belonging to the State of Punjab as per record at the time of their entry in service (A certificate on prescribed Proforma by the Commanding Officers of the Unit to be furnished) and
- (vi) Children, wards and dependents of the ex-employees of military & para military forces personnel belonging to the State of Punjab as per record at the time of their entry into service.
- (d) The guidelines issued for the grant of residence certificate/bonafide resident of Punjab by the Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-2 Branch) vide No. 1/3/95-3PP-2/9619, dated the 6th June, 1996 ID No.1/2/96-3PP-2/8976 dated 7th July 1998 and No. 1/2/95-3PP-2/80 dated the 1st January, 1999 and further instructions, issued by the Department, if any, will be adhered to in letter and spirit while making admission.

(8) GENERAL CONDITIONS:-

1. The merit of each candidate shall be determined on the basis of marks secured by him or her in the Common Entrance Test (CET).
- ✓ 2. The minimum qualifying marks in CET will be 15% for General Category students and 10% for SC/ST candidates. No candidate will be allowed admission in any B.Ed. College of State of Punjab without obtain in minimum marks in qualifying the Common Entrance Test (B.Ed.)-2017-18 to be conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh.
3. The combined merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks secured by the candidates in the Common Entrance Test.
- ✓ 4. As 5 % marks (of those obtained in the CET by the candidate) will be given to candidates seeking admissions under 85% quota, which have passed their 8th and 10th classes examination from school situated in rural areas of Punjab. For this, they will have to submit a certificate of that school falling in rural area at the time of passing 8th as well as 10th class issued by the Head of the school, duly counter signed by the concerned D.E.O (by the concerned Sarpanch in case of school affiliated to C.B.S.E/ I.C.S.E)
5. The University will notify the last date for submission of application forms for CET and counseling.
6. The reservation of seats as given above shall be strictly adhered to. However, in case seats in a reserved category remain vacant, on account of non-availability of qualified candidates, such seats may be filled up from the general category candidates.
7. The admission of total number of seats in the colleges of education for candidates belonging to different subjects will be done as per the norms laid down by the N.C.T.E as per clause 3.1 of the appendix no. i.e.1-25 students per teacher for a school subject.
8. Candidates applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form to be submitted to the University in the first instance before the CET. No change of category will be entertained /permitted at a later stage in the application form.
9. The allocation of college will be made through online/offline counseling by the authorized university.

10. There will be only one counseling (As per Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's CWP No. 276 of 2012) for admission to B.Ed. seats and the total process of counseling will be completed in 25 days by the university.
11. The subject combination will be decided by the admission committee constituted by Panjab University, Chandigarh.
12. The counseling schedule will be prepared by the Admission Committee constituted by the Vice Chancellor, Panjab University, Chandigarh.
13. All seats in the B.Ed. colleges of Punjab will be filled through centralized Common Entrance Test followed by counseling by Panjab University, Chandigarh.
14. After completion of counseling the admission committee will take decision about filling of unfilled seats. The method proposed would be in light of the decisions taken by the Punjab and Haryana High Court regarding C.W.P. No. 19518 dated 14.12.2009. The admission committee would fill all the seats subject to the availability of eligible candidates.
15. In counseling only the major subject would be allotted by the university. The minor subject would be allotted by the college. Allocation of seat does not mean confirmation of admission. The admission will be confirmed by the college concerned after checking and verification of documents.
16. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that correct information is provided when the on-line form is filled.
17. Any incorrect information will lead to disqualification.
18. Checking final certificates of the students allocated to the college would be the responsibility of the college.
19. In the first instance, counseling of All India seats will be held. The seats falling vacant in the All India quota will be converted into **85% state Quota Science and Arts seats**. Then counseling for Science seats will be held. The seats falling vacant in the Science quota will be converted into Arts seats. After that, the counseling will start for the Arts seats.
20. Whatever information the college wants to give to the candidate should be made available on the college website. A separate printed prospectus is not required. There should be a help desk in each college to guide the students about the subject combinations and filling up of admission forms.
21. The candidates shall deposit half of the Semester fee at the time of admission with the college in which they are admitted and remaining fee of the semester in the month of Sept/Oct, as decided by the concerned college and advertised in the prospectus of the college. The 2nd fee will be collected at the start of the 2nd Semester.
22. The candidates who are admitted in the Government College of Education and the Regional Centre, Bathinda of Punjabi University, Patiala shall deposit their fee directly in their respective colleges / regional centre.
23. The university shall submit the complete list of admitted candidates to the undersigned with a copy to the Director of Public Instructions (Colleges) Punjab within one month of the completion of admission process.

(9) **MANAGEMENT QUOTA SEATS:-**

1. In pursuance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's Judgment in T.M.A. Pai Foundation and others versus State of Karnataka and others and in view of the interim Policy Regulations Notification, dated 10th June 2003 issued by the University Grants Commission 15% of the seats out of 85% state quota seats in un-aided private self-financing institutions shall be treated as management quota seats and shall be brought out of the purview of centralized counseling to be conducted by the University.

2. The University shall exclude the management quota seats (showing the subject combination) from the centralized counseling and accordingly publish the details of these seats (institute-wise) provided by the respective institutes.
3. The seats under the management quota shall be filled up by the concerned institute in the following manner:-
 - (a) The management quota seats will be filled up after counseling only.
 - (b) Each institute duly authorized by the University conducting the counseling shall publish an advertisement, mentioning the name of the institute and seats against subject-wise combinations offered, in two leading newspapers (i.e. one in English and one in Punjabi Language) on the last day of counseling and may repeat this advertisement subsequently.
 - (c) The Management of the Institute shall fill up management quota seats on the basis of combined merit list through its own counseling in a transparent manner.
 - (d) There shall be no reservation, whatsoever, in respect of the prescribed management quota seats.
 - (e) The concerned college shall have to inform in advance whether stay in hostel is compulsory or not and if yes what are the hostel charges inclusive of rent, mess charges etc.
 - (f) The basic eligibility criteria regarding educational qualification etc. shall remain the same as printed in the Brochure/Prospectus and as prescribed by the respective university.
10. The Schedule for B.Ed. Admissions will be notified / published by Panjab University, Chandigarh.
11. Fees & Funds:
 - i) For admission to private self financed B. Ed. colleges the fee and funds structure will be according to the instruction issued by the Government of Punjab.
12. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Panjab University, Chandigarh shall be final.





Aided and Private Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated to (1) Panjab University, Chandigarh (2) Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, (3) Punjabi University, Patiala. The scheme of admission through Common Entrance Test is notified for the information of all concerned. The information about Colleges of Education & the number of seats available therein as per approval granted by the National Council for Teacher Education(N.C.T.E)are placed at Annexure-A. Before publishing the prospectus, the Panjab University will ensure that each and every institute is duly affiliated with the respective University for the seats as quoted in list at Annexure-A.

1. ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR IN COMMON ENTRANCE TEST:-



The Governor of Punjab is pleased to appoint the Panjab University Chandigarh as the authority competent to conduct the Common Entrance Test (CET) and centralized counseling for B.Ed. course for the Session 2019-20 in all the Colleges of Education (Govt., Govt. Aided and Private Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated to (1) Panjab University, Chandigarh (2) Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, (3) Punjabi University, Patiala. The scheme of admission through Common Entrance Test is notified for the information of all concerned. The information about Colleges of Education & the number of seats available therein as per approval granted by the National Council for Teacher Education (N.C.T.E) are placed at Annexure-A. Before publishing the prospectus, the Panjab University will ensure that each and every institute is duly affiliated with the respective University for the seats as quoted in list at Annexure-A.

I. ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR IN COMMON ENTRANCE TEST:-

a) i) Applicant must have obtained at least 50 % marks in the Bachelor's Degree including a graduation degree in engineering and technology (45% in case of SC, BC candidates) or;

ii) At least 50% marks in the Master's degree in any stream (45% in case of SC, BC candidates)

(Note: Where ever grades are awarded, the same would be converted into percentage as per rules of the university/institution awarding the grades)

b) The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favor of the reserved categories shall be as per the policy of the Govt. of Punjab.

c) Applicants who have appeared for qualifying examination and whose results have not been declared may be provisionally appear to apply for Common Entrance Test. They shall become eligible for counseling only after they have produced the evidence of having satisfied the eligibility conditions as in 1a above.

- d) Applicants who fall in the category of result late (RL)/Re-evaluation/Compartment cases shall be considered, if their results are declared before final counseling, subject to availability of seats.

2. PLACEMENT OF CANDIDATES :-

- a) The admission of all Colleges of Education (Govt., Govt. Aided and Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and Punjabi University, Patiala will be done strictly as per norms laid down by N.C.T.E and by the Admission Committee to be constituted by the Panjab University Chandigarh. The details of Common Entrance Test and counseling shall be determined and notified separately by the University.
- b) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test, their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria in order of preference:-
- (i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
 - (ii) Candidate older in age.

3. DIVISION OF SEATS :-

- a) 85% seats will be reserved for the Candidates from within the State of Punjab and 15% seats will be open to candidates of other States/U.Ts on the basis of merit of CET prepared on all India basis excluding Punjab. The eligibility criteria for 85% seats will be that the candidate must be a resident of Punjab State in terms of the Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-11 Br.) letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/96 19, dated the 6th June, 1996 and letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/80, dated 1st January, 1999. The notifications are annexed at Annexure B and C respectively.
- b) If sufficient number of candidates belonging to reserved category (ies) is not available, the vacant seats will be offered to candidates in the open category. Likewise, if seats under 15% category remain vacant, these would be transferred to 85% category and vice-versa. Further if suitable candidates are not available in any one of the sub-categories of reserved categories, the seats so available will be filled up by the candidates from the other sub categories and if they are not available in any sub- category, then seats shall be filled up from general/open category candidates.

- c) Seats up to 70% of sanctioned intake at Malwa Central College of Education for Women, Ludhiana shall be reserved for rural women candidates who are bona fide residents of the State of Punjab.

4. RESERVATION OF SEATS :-

Reservation of seats shall be as per the policy of the Government of Punjab applicable at the time of admission.

5. GENERAL CONDITIONS:-

- a) The Panjab University Chandigarh will notify the schedule for CET and counselling sessions.
- b) The combined merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks secured by the candidates in the Common Entrance Test.
- c) The minimum qualifying marks in CET will be 25% for General Category candidates and 20% for SC/ST candidates.
- d) While calculating merit, credit of 1% of maximum marks will be given to candidates seeking admissions under 85% category, who have passed their 10th and 12th class examination from schools situated in rural areas of Punjab. For this, they will have to submit a certificate issued by the Head/Principal of the school stating that the student has passed 10th and 12th class from his school and that the school falls in the rural area. The certificate should be counter signed by the Sarpanch of the village.
- e) There will be two counseling sessions for admission and the whole process of counseling shall be completed within one month. The shifting of seats will be allowed during the second counseling only.
- f) The admission to all seats belonging to different subjects in the colleges of Education will be done as per the norms laid down by the N.C.T.E as per clause 3.1 of the appendix iv of its Gazette Notification dated 28.11.2014. The subject combination will be decided by the admission committee constituted by the Panjab University Chandigarh
- g) Applicant applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form. No change of category will be entertained /permitted at a later stage in the application form.
- h) The allocation of college will be made through online/offline counseling by the authorized university.
- i) In the first instance, counseling of All India category will be held. The seats falling vacant in the All India category will be converted into 85%state

- category. Then counseling for science subjects will be held. The seats falling vacant in the Science category will be converted into Arts category. After that, the counseling will start for the Arts category.
- j) In counseling, only the major subject would be allotted by the university. The minor subject would be allotted by the college. Allocation of seat does not mean confirmation of admission. The admission will be confirmed by the college concerned after checking and verification of documents, which shall be responsibility of the college.
 - k) Any incorrect information by the candidate in online form or otherwise provided shall lead to his/her disqualification without any intimation thereof.
 - l) Colleges shall provide all information regarding the course and other facilities being provided to the students on their website.
 - m) Mandatory Proforma enclosed at Annexure-D will be submitted by Colleges of Education to the Panjab University Chandigarh (any college not submitting this proforma shall not be permitted to admit students for session 2019-20).
 - n) The colleges shall charge only 50% of the fee of first semester at the time of admission.
 - o) The concerned college shall have to inform in advance whether stay in hostel is compulsory or not and if yes what are the hostel charges inclusive of rent, mess charges etc.
 - p) The Panjab University Chandigarh shall submit the complete list of admitted candidates to the department of Higher Education, Govt. of Punjab with a copy to the Director Public Instructions (Colleges) Punjab within one month of the completion of admission process.

6. MANAGEMENT QUOTA SEATS:-

1. In pursuance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's Judgment in T.M.A Pai Foundation and others versus State of Karnataka and others and in view of the interim Policy Regulations Notification, dated 10th June 2003 issued by the University Grants Commission 15% of the seats out of 85% state quota seats in un-aided private self-financing institutions shall be treated as management quota seats and shall be brought out of the purview of centralized counseling to be conducted by the University.
2. The University shall exclude the management quota seats (showing the subject combination) from the centralized counseling and accordingly publish the details of these seats (institute-wise) provided by the respective institutes.

3. The seats under the management quota shall be filled up by the concerned institute in the following manner:-

- (a) The management quota seats will be filled up only after the second counseling is over as per the notified schedule.
- (b) Each institute duly authorized by the University, conducting the counseling, shall publish an advertisement, mentioning the name of institute and seats against subject-wise combinations offered, in two leading newspapers (i.e. one in English and one in Punjabi Language). On the last day of counseling and may repeat this advertisement subsequently.
- (c) The Management of the Institute shall fill up management quota seats on the basis of a merit list of applicants who had applied in pursuance to advertisement as stated in 3(b) above through its own counseling in a transparent manner.
- (d) There shall be no reservation, in respect of the prescribed management quota seats.
- (e) No college will be allowed to give any advertisement in the newspapers regarding admission before the second counseling is over. Any college found doing this, the admission committee shall cancel admission process of that college.

7. Fees & Funds:

The fee and funds structure in private self-financed colleges of education will be according to the instructions issued by the Government of Punjab.

8. In case of any dispute:



I am directed to invite your attention to the Punjab Government Circular letter No. 1/3/95-3PPH/2043, dated 29-1-1996 vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of domicile for the purposes of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgement delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain Vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421 wherein it was held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Residence' be used in the instructions issued by the State Governments on the subject. The Governor of Punjab is pleased to appoint the Punjabi University Patiala as the authority competent to conduct the Common Entrance Test (CET) and centralized counseling for B.Ed. course for the Session 2020-21 in all the Colleges of Education (Govt., Govt. Aided and Private Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated to (1) Panjabi University, Chandigarh (2) Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, and (3) Punjabi University, Patiala. The scheme of admission through Common Entrance Test is notified for the information of all concerned. The information about Colleges of Education & the number of seats available there in as per approval granted by the National Council for Teacher Education (N.C.T.E) are placed at Annexure-A. Before publishing the prospectus, the Punjabi University Patiala will ensure that each and every institute is duly affiliated with the respective University for the seats as quoted in list at Annexure-A.



1. ELIGIBILITY TO APPEAR IN COMMON ENTRANCE TEST:-

- a) i) Applicant must have obtained at least 50 % marks in the Bachelor's Degree including a graduation degree in engineering and technology (45% in case of SC, BC candidates) or;
ii) At least 50% marks in the Master's degree in any stream (45% in case of SC, BC candidates)
(Note: Where ever grades are awarded, the same would be converted into percentage as per rules of the university/institution awarding the grades)
- b) The reservation in seats and relaxation in the qualifying marks in favor of the reserved categories shall be as per the policy of the Govt. of Punjab.
- c) Applicants who have appeared for qualifying examination and whose results have not been declared may be provisionally appear to apply for Common Entrance Test. They shall become eligible for counseling only after they have produced the evidence of having satisfied the eligibility conditions as in 1a above.
- d) Applicants who fall in the category of result late (RL)/Re-evaluation/Compartment cases shall be considered, if their results are declared before final counseling, subject to availability of seats.

2. PLACEMENT OF CANDIDATES :-

- a) The admission of all Colleges of Education (Govt., Govt. Aided and Self-Financed Colleges) affiliated with Panjab University, Chandigarh, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and Punjabi University, Patiala will be done strictly as per norms laid down by N.C.T.E and by the Admission Committee to be constituted by the Punjabi University Patiala. The details of Common Entrance Test and counseling shall be determined and notified separately by the University.
- b) When two or more candidates have secured equal marks in the Common Entrance Test, their inter-se merit for admission will be decided on the following criteria in order of preference:-
 - (i) Candidate with higher percentage of marks in qualifying degree.
 - (ii) Candidate older in age.

3. DIVISION OF SEATS :-

- a) 85% seats will be reserved for the Candidates from within the State of Punjab and 15% seats will be open to candidates of other States/U.Ts on the basis of merit of CET prepared on all India basis excluding Punjab. The eligibility criteria for 85% seats will be that the candidate must be a resident of Punjab State in terms of the Punjab Government, Department of Personnel and Administrative Reforms (PP-11 Br.) letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/96 19, dated the 6th June, 1996 and letter No. 1/3/95-3PP-11/80, dated 1st January, 1999. The notifications are annexed at Annexure B and C respectively.
- b) If sufficient number of candidates belonging to reserved category (ies) is not available, the vacant seats will be offered to candidates in the open category. Likewise, if seats under 15% category remain vacant, these would be transferred to 85% category and vice-versa. Further if suitable candidates are not available in any one of the sub-categories of reserved categories, the seats so available will be filled up by the candidates from the other sub categories and if they are not available in any sub-category, then seats shall be filled up from general/open category candidates.
- c) Seats up to 70% of sanctioned intake at Malwa Central College of Education for Women, Ludhiana shall be reserved for rural women candidates who are bona fide residents of the State of Punjab.

4. RESERVATION OF SEATS :-

Reservation of seats shall be as per the policy of the Government of Punjab applicable at the time of admission.

5. GENERAL CONDITIONS:-

- a) The Punjabi University Patiala will notify the schedule for CET and counseling sessions.
- b) The combined merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks secured by the candidates in the Common Entrance Test.
- c) The minimum qualifying marks in CET will be 25% for General Category candidates and 20% for SC/ST candidates.
- d) While calculating merit, credit of 1% of maximum marks will be given to candidates seeking admissions under 85% category, which have passed their 10th and 12th class examination from schools situated in rural areas of Punjab. For this, they will have to submit a certificate issued by the Head/Principal of the school stating that the student has passed 10th and 12th class from his school and that the school falls in the rural area. The certificate should be counter signed by the Sarpanch of the village.
- e) There will be two counseling sessions for admission and the whole process of counseling shall be completed within one month. The shifting of seats will be allowed during the second counseling only.
- f) In case of seats remaining vacant after final round of counseling the same would be filled as per guidelines/directions issued by Department of Higher Education from time to time.
- g) The admission to all seats belonging to different subjects in the colleges of Education will be done as per the norms laid down by the N.C.T.E as per clause 3.1 of the appendix iv of its Gazette Notification dated 28.11.2014. The subject combination will be decided by the Admission Committee constituted by the Punjabi University Patiala
- h) Applicant applying for the reserved category shall carefully indicate the claim for only one category in the admission form. No change of category will be entertained /permitted at a later stage in the application form.
- i) The allocation of college will be made through online/offline counseling by the authorized university.
- j) In the first instance, counseling of All India category will be held. The seats falling vacant in the All India category will be converted into 85% state category. Then counseling for

- science subjects will be held. The seats falling vacant in the Science category will be converted into Arts category. After that, the counseling will start for the Arts category.
- k) In counseling, only the major subject would be allotted by the University. The minor subjects would be allotted by the college. Allocation of seat does not mean confirmation of admission. The admission will be confirmed by the college concerned after checking and verification of documents, which shall be responsibility of the college.
 - l) Any incorrect information by the candidate in online form or otherwise provided shall lead to his/her disqualification without any intimation thereof.
 - m) Colleges shall provide all information regarding the course and other facilities being provided to the students on their website.
 - n) Mandatory Proforma enclosed at Annexure-D will be submitted by Colleges of Education to the Punjabi University Patiala (any college not submitting this proforma shall not be permitted to admit students for session (2020-21).
 - o) The colleges shall charge only 50% of the fee of first semester at the time of admission.
 - p) The concerned college shall have to inform in advance whether stay in hostel is compulsory or not and if yes what are the hostel charges inclusive of rent, mess charges etc.
 - q) The Punjabi University Patiala shall submit the complete list of admitted candidates to the department of Higher Education, Govt. of Punjab with a copy to the Director Public Instructions (Colleges) Punjab within one month of the completion of admission process.

6. MANAGEMENT QUOTA SEATS:-

1. In pursuance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India's Judgment in T.M.A Pai Foundation and others versus State of Karnataka and others and in view of the Interim Policy Regulations Notification, dated 10th June 2003 issued by the University Grants Commission 15% of the seats out of 85% state quota seats in un-aided private self-financing institutions shall be treated as management quota seats and shall be brought out of the purview of centralized counseling to be conducted by the University.
2. The University shall exclude the management quota seats (showing the subject combination) from the centralized counseling and accordingly publish the details of these seats (institute-wise) provided by the respective institutes.
3. The seats under the management quota shall be filled up by the concerned institute in the following manner:-
 - (a) The management quota seats will be filled up only after the second counseling is over as per the notified schedule.
 - (b) Each institute duly authorized by the University, conducting the counseling, shall publish an advertisement, mentioning the name of institute and seats against subject-wise combinations offered, in two leading newspapers (i.e. one in English and one in Punjabi Language), after the complete process of counseling by the Punjabi University Patiala is over and may repeat this advertisement subsequently.
 - (c) The Management of the Institute shall fill up management quota seats on the basis of a merit list of applicants who had applied in pursuance to advertisement as stated in 3(b) above through its own counseling in a transparent manner.
 - (d) There shall be no reservation, in respect of the prescribed management quota seats.
 - (e) No college will be allowed to give any advertisement in the newspapers regarding admission before the final counseling is over. Any college found doing this: the Admission Committee shall cancel admission process of that college.

7. Fees & Funds:

The fee and funds structure in private self-financed colleges of Education will be according to the instructions issued by the Government of Punjab.

8. In case of any dispute:

The decision of the Punjabi University Patiala shall be final.


